## HISTORIC CENTER



The meeting point of different historical periods, from the Pre-Hispanic era to the colonial era and all the way to the modernity. Cultural world heritage by the UNESCO since 2007.



### Metropolitan Cathedral

The top architectonic colonial work. Three different architectonic styles: Renaissance, Baroque and Neoclassical. Appreciate the richness of the altarpieces and in its monumental pipe organ.



### National Palace

The epicenter of the country's political scene since the viceregal era the National Palace is the home of the executive power of Mexico. Famous thanks to the Diego Rivera's murals.



### Main Temple

Visit the sacred remnants of the Mexica building that remained hidden under the bedrock of the constructions for centuries.



### MUNAL

The National Art Museum hosts a permanent retrospective of the Mexican art since the XVI century all the way to the present.



### Palace of Fine Arts

There are fresco paintings inside by the great Mexican mural painters, as well as a spectacular curtain designed by Tiffany's in cultural events.



### MAP

Museum focused on the popular art by the Mexican people, which displays the different artistic traditions in each region.

A walk across Reforma Avenue--On foot or by bike-, discover the magical sites inside the Chapultepec Park area (museums, zoo or parks) the modernity and the majestic of the “Zona Rosa”



## Anthropology Museum

The most important museum compound of the country, a repository of the country's Pre-Hispanic past and its ethnographic present. 22 exhibition halls.



## Angel of Independence

One of Mexico City's major symbols. It majestically elevates in the middle of Reforma Avenue. Meeting point for the national sports triumphs' celebrations.



## Castle of Chapultepec

Construction of the viceroyalty era which was used as the Viceroy's rest house, as well as Maximiliano and Carlota's Imperial Palace during the second Mexican Empire.



## Museum of Modern Art

Inside its' four chambers, it safeguards and exhibits the Mexican Modern Art history, it also displays international contemporary art samples open to the public.



## Tamayo Museum

Displays innovative exhibitions of the most representative international contemporary art along with its' own personal collection.



## Muestras culturales

Reforma Avenue displays sculptural and cultural samples all year long. It's a delight to walk through and discover every corner of it.



We can find endless touristic attractions in the south of Mexico City, such as the cobbled streets found in San Angel and Coyoacan. You can also find museums or natural wonders like the gutters from the former Lake of Texcoco.



### Xochimilco

The legacy of the ancient indigenous people. Enjoy the picturesque ride across its' gutters using a colorful "trajinera" (Xochimilco colorful boats) these areas are the remnants from the former Lake of Texcoco.



### Coyoacan

Discover this very Mexican incredible magical district. Full of temples, old manors, colonial squares, marketplaces, museums and handcrafts. Wander through the cobbled streets and Mexican taverns.



### University city-UNAM

A museum city. Cherish David Alfaro Siqueiros' murals in the Rectory Tower, Juan O' Gorman's in the Main Library and Diego Rivera's in the Olympic Stadium.



### MUAC

UNAM University's contemporary Art Museum. Inside its'14 halls, we can find displayed representative works of all the artistic movements in Mexico since the second half of the XX century all the way until now.



### Frida Kahlo museum-The Blue House

Go inside the intimate world of Frida Kahlo. Cross the halls, the rooms, the studios and the gardens where the artist lived; first during her youth and later on her final days along with her husband Diego Rivera.



### Siqueiros' Polyforum

Admire "La marcha de la humanidad" mural that covers all the walls and roofs of David Alfaro Siqueiros' legacy.



Polanco: Modernity and the chick area of the capital city. Both Polanco and New Polanco offer an endless number of cultural, gastronomic and shopping activities to the tourist.



### Soumaya Museum

Inside the cutting-edge building, we can find the art collection of the Carlos Slim A.C. Foundation which is the second biggest Auguste Rodin world collection and it also has exhibitions of artists like Picasso, Dali, Tamayo, Siqueiros or Rivera.



### Inbursa Aquarium

With a 3 thousand and 500 hundred square meters in four sub-levels extension. We can find 10 thousand creatures from 307 species; including sharks, penguins and stingrays.



### Jumex Museum

Space focused on the display and support of the international and national contemporary art; as well as in encouraging the discovery, reflection and learning. The Jumex collection is considered one of the most important in Latin-America.



### Polanco, a real shopping experience.

The fashionista heaven, you'll find the best brands in the world; close to the hotel area and with excellent restaurants to enjoy. The three most attractive spots for shopping are A) Presidente Masaryk avenue, the golden mile of the capital city with the most exclusive boutiques. B) Antara Fashion Hall an open-air shopping mall. C) The innovative "Palacio de Palacios", 60 square meters of selected stores



### Teatro Telcel

The newest and best-equipped drama theater in Mexico City- Placed 6 floors underground, its considered the most complete in Latin-America. World level musical plays such as Wicked and the Lion King have been presented here.
